Novellas and short stories are, however, notoriously difficult to sell and Cath finds people asking her when she's going to write a 'proper novel'. Nevertheless she has been successful in finding publishers for both a second novella and a collection of short stories. The Abergavenny-based writer talks in defence of the novella and other short fiction. She questions the concept of the 'full-length novel', and considers what's in the favour of shorter forms of literature from the point of view of both writers and readers.

Something of His Art: Walking to Lubeck with JS Bach, critically acclaimed author and journalist, Horatio Clare, retraces part of Bach's journey. In the words of one reviewer. 

The Forgotten Films of WWII


The Creative Lives of Edward and Prudence Maufe
